



OH&S POLICY

It is the policy of MYS to conduct its activities in such a way that the health, safety and well-being of employees and Sub Contractors and the public are not in any way impaired or prejudiced as a result of working within or for the Ministry.

To aid in the implementation of this OH&S Policy, MYS shall:

- Comply with all relevant OH&S legal & other requirements,
- Provide information, instruction and training for employees to increase personal understanding of workplace hazards and to ensure proper supervision;
- Involve employees and sub-contractors on health and safety matters, and consult with them in ways to reduce workplace hazards and improve control systems;
- Develop, implement & improve the occupational health & safety system with a focus on the prevention of illness and injury for all employees.
- Set short and long-term objectives in health and safety management as part of an ongoing action plan and regularly review its performance.
- Regularly evaluate the effectiveness of the OH&S management system to ensure ongoing continuous improvement.
- This Policy publicly available to all, and communicate with all relevant affected and interested parties on the OH&S performance of the Ministry.
- Review OH&S Policy periodically to ensure that it remains relevant and appropriate to the Ministry.

MYS recognise that Health and Safety is both an individual and shared responsibility of all employees, sub-contractors and other persons involved with the operation of the Ministry. In this regard, we emphasise the need to follow and adhere to safe work practices at all times, to ensure that no person is exposed to a health and safety hazard for themselves or any other person, and to develop an ever improving safety culture within the Ministry.
